## The Means of Our Growth in the Mind of Christ

Jesus developed the mind of Christ <u>in His humanity</u>, resulting in His <u>understanding</u> of His Father's will (Luke 2:40, 47, 50). Who was His teacher? (John 7:16; 8:28) How was He taught? (Is 50:4-6) Much of what He learned was <u>expository</u>. (Mt 9:13; 12:7; 22:29)

Wisdom is the application of scriptural truth to the issues of life.

How can we attain wisdom? (Josh 1:8; 1 Pet 2:2) The OT provides all that we are with all that we need (Ps 19:7-11; 119:97-100) The NT confirms these things. (2 Tim 3:16-17; John 5:46-47)

How do the scriptures renew our minds? Dt 17:18-20 Would that be good for you?

Why read all the Bible? to gain familiarity with all of Scripture to grasp the orientation of its parts to experience a comprehensive transformation (2 Cor 3:18) to maintain a proper scriptural balance to be directed to complete obedience (Neh 8:14; 13:1-3)
